A Primer on Bylaws - Information from the 2018 VVA Leadership Conference

What Is a Bylaw?

- A fundamental rule that structures the chapter
- A rule that is too important to suspend
- A rule that is written and agreed upon by the chapter members
- A contract between the chapter and the members
- A rule that, in some way, may limit the rights of chapter members
- Can be amended by the members of the chapter

Governing Documents in Order of Rank

- 1. Federal Law
- 2. State corporation laws
- 3. Articles of Incorporation
- 4. Constitution of VVA, Inc.
- 5. Chapter Bylaws
- 6. Standing Rules
- 7. Parliamentary authority (Robert's Rules of Order)
- 8. Policies and Procedures

What Does Not Belong in Bylaws?

- Statements copied from State corporate law, articles of incorporation, the constitution of VVA, Inc. or Robert's Rules of Order
- Confusing language or legalese
- Minutiae
- Information related to day-to-day business practices
 - Policies and/or procedures, who does what, etc.

How can the chapter run effectively without all the other stuff?

- Create a Policy and Procedure Manual
 - A procedure becomes a standing rule if adopted by majority vote
- Adopt Standing Rules
 - Regulates day-to-day operation of the chapter if approved by a majority
